TRY TO:

- ☐ Be an <u>Undergraduate Instructional Apprentice or PSET Tutor</u>. (3.5 GPA required)
- ☐ If you are interested in general business or investment banking consider applying to the <u>Rising Leaders Program</u>. (3.5 GPA required)
- ☐ SPRING Quarter: Apply to take <u>ECON</u>
 <u>191A/B</u>. It is a great way to learn to conduct your own research, as well as connect with a faculty member. (3.5 GPA required)
- ☐ Enroll in our <u>one-unit honors courses</u> (3.5 GPA required) & advanced topics classes (109T, 165T, etc.) These are excellent ways to connect with faculty and a great connection may lead to an informed letter of recommendation someday!
- ☐ Consider taking a <u>Special Studies Course</u> (ECON 199). It is an opportunity to work on your own research with a faculty member and receive academic credit.

- For econ, check out the <u>American Economic Association</u> website for detailed information.
- ☐ Speak with faculty, lecturers & grad students about graduate education.
- ☐ Attend graduate school fairs.
- ☐ PRO-TIP: Get to know the faculty as they are more likely to write letters that influence admissions committees. Small classes such as honors classes, 191AB, and advanced topics sections are a great place to start.
